Dear Mr. Crane,

I enclose a diagram of the Ray Machine as made here in 1942 .
So I hope it will be of interest to you. It will not be necessary to
return it. It is to be noted that it was made only for one frequency;
obviously it would be necessary to alter the design to enable many
frequencies to be used.

I am at a loss in regard to what you say about my making reports
on cancer patients. I never saw these patients; so it must have been
Dr. Milbank Johnson himself who wrote out the reports. I know he was very
active about the "Rife Ray" in 1935, and he spoke of its action to me at that
time.

I am very glad you got a successful photograph of the virus.
It makes me wonder if I could send you a (tiny) sample of the Rous Fowl
Virus. I am "on the move" from the laboratory I have had now for 18 years
at the Hospital where I now occupy an "Honorary" position, - they need
the laboratory for some other department now. So I am going through all
the accumulated material, and if I can find the tube of virus which I feel
sure I saved from McGill, I may be able to send you a small phial by
"sample post". It would need emulsifying in sterile water, or saline - and
should be incubated; or, better still, inoculated under the skin of a young
fowl; this would "rejuvenate" it, and from the resultant growths any desired

(3 weeks usually)

amount could be obtained. Then the tissue would be desiccated by the usual method, and finally ground up into powder again, *in the form it keeps indefinitely.*

I will be glad to know how you get on with your researches. My best remembrances to Dr. Rife, too,
